PROVIDING EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS TO SUCCEED

[Clark College Disability Support Services](#) assist students achieve their goals by providing accommodations--academic adjustments or supports. Steps for requesting accommodations can be found [here](#). Official documentation is best for determining accommodations, but is not necessarily required. Accommodations must be secured by the student, not by a parent or guardian.

Examples of accommodations include:

♦ sign language interpreters, ♦closed captioning, ♦extended time for tests, ♦readers ♦alternate formats, including braille, e-text, and large print.

DSS also hosts events and programs including Disability Peer mentors and Autism and ADHD Support Groups. Also check out [Clark’s Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion \(ODEI\) events and resources](#).

Many students from our counties attend a CGCC campus in Hood River or The Dalles. The CGCC [Disability Resources](#) department seeks to maximize opportunities for students with disabilities to succeed, growing personally and educationally. The [handbook](#) provides a general overview and how to apply. For accommodations, students must provide documentation from a licensed professional.

Documentation: a dated, signed letter or report on professional letterhead listing the disability and functional limitations.

Professional: physician, audiologist, rehabilitation counselor, psychologist, or learning disabilities specialist.

Examples of accommodations include:

- ◆Advising ◆Notetaking, writing, and reading/taping support ◆Sign language and oral interpreting
- ◆Test proctoring ◆Adaptive equipment ◆Registration assistance ◆Resource and referral assistance
- ◆GED accommodations

It is important to schedule an appointment with Shayna Dahl, Advisor at 541-506-6011 as soon as possible; you do not have to wait to enroll. Students using sign language must contact Disability Resources at least 4 weeks prior to the beginning of each term.
